Name of Process: Millport Field Trip Student Information Recording

Edinburgh Napier University provides this information to explain how we use your personal data. Protecting your personal data is important to us and we only collect and process data which is necessary for us to provide the information, services and goods you require. This is in compliance with UK data protection legislation (“the legislation”), that is, the UK Data Protection Act 2018 (“DPA 2018”) and the General Data Protection Regulation: EU 2016-679 (“GDPR”) as amended by “EU Exit” Regulations 2019 and now known as the UK GDPR.

Purposes for collection/processing	Collection and temporary storage of student information to administer and manage the trip, and also to ensure safety during the residential field trip. Some information is also shared with the course provider.
Legal basis	The legal basis the University relies on is Article 6(1)(e): for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of the official authority vested in the controller, namely the University’s Statutory Instruments : “for the objects of providing education, carrying out research, and promoting teaching, research and general scholarship” and the administration thereof. Article 9 conditions for processing special category (sensitive) personal data (racial/ethnic origin, political opinions, trade union membership, religious/philosophical beliefs, genetic/biometric data, health data, sex life, sexual orientation) include: Art 9(2)(g) – Public interest (specifically as per Schedules in the Data Protection Act 2018) For the purposes of ensuring the health and safety of students, safeguarding and to make necessary adjustments where required for individuals with a particular disability or medical condition.
What type/classes/fields of information are collected	Name, contact details, GP details, next of kin, gender, health conditions that may impact on ability to undertake course, allergies, medical conditions and medication, dietary requirements.

How long is the information kept for	Duration of the field course (5 days) and will be destroyed as soon as possible within the current academic year. Accident/incident records will be shared with the University Health & Safety team, or

	other relevant colleagues and retained as necessary in line with legal requirements.
